

Fort Gratiot PetSafe Canine Commons, 4788 Parker Rd: a 2-acre dog park with separate fenced areas for small/medium and medium/large dogs. The park is open to all, year round, dawn to dusk. There is no fee to use the park.

Fort Gratiot Pond, 4888 Parker Rd: features pavilions, a pond with covered dock, playground equipment and parking for and access to the Fort Gratiot bike path. The Fort Gratiot Yacht Club can be found racing RC boats throughout the summer. The free fall family event, Scarecrow Saturday, is also held at this park.

Kettlewell Pond, between 24th Avenue and Parker Road: accessible from the Fort Gratiot Bike path, in the Fort Gratiot pond area.






Lakeport is the commercial hub of Burtchville Township and offers residents and visitors many conveniences without traveling very far. Shoppers can find groceries, fishing bait, firewood, banking services and more at area businesses. Stop in town to satisfy your appetite and visit one of the family style restaurants, grab an ice cream cone or relax at one of the cozy pubs with friends. Bed & Breakfasts and resort cabins are also available for overnight travelers.

Located 10 miles north of Port Huron, this lakefront community is also situated between the day-use and campgrounds of Lakeport State Park. The park features over 347 acres of well-cared for grounds with 286 campsites to enable anyone to enjoy a picnic, camping, swimming or fishing on the shores of beautiful Lake Huron. The park also offers a picnic area with shelters, mini-cabins, a beach house, concession stand, a playground, and hiking trails.









A charming harbor village on the shores of Lake Huron, situated 20 miles north of Port Huron, Lexington has earned the moniker of the first resort north. Visitors experience the relaxed feeling of an "up north" resort area with a short easy drive.

The Village of Lexington offers an appealing combination of sophistication and history, along with a touch of nostalgia for a way of life of years gone by. The area features unique shops, cultural entertainment and family dining, along with B&B's and a wealth of quaint cottages. The historic downtown shopping district leads you to a State Harbor of refuge with a limestone seawall, featuring a walkway surrounded by breathtaking views of Lake Huron. One of the most popular events is the celebration of Independence Day with a harbor front display of Fireworks and an All American Parade in July. The annual Lexington Fine Arts Street fair is held in August, bringing over 125 artists and fine crafters to the streets of the downtown area. A Bach Festival, classic car shows, motorcycle shows and tractor shows are also on their busy summer schedule. Thumbfest, a celebration of traditional music, is held in September.














Hot Wheels Weekend



Dedicated to the Great Lakes, BoatNerd has grown into a community website that averages over 27,000 visitors a day and more than 2.25 million page views each month. Lakes Pilot Boat

Pilot boats ferry pilots to all foreign flag vessels that travel the St. Lawrence Seaway. All foreign-flag vessels over 300 gross tons are required to carry pilots while transiting the St. Lawrence Seaway/ Great Lakes System.

The Port Huron office is responsible for supplying pilots to foreign ships that travel Lake Erie, Lake St. Clair, the Detroit and St. Clair Rivers. The boats stationed in Port Huron also transfer pilots to vessels traveling in Lake Huron.

The boats currently stationed in Port Huron are the Huron Belle, the Huron Maid and the Huron Spirit, pictured above. All three are all-weather vessels and operate 24 hours a day, 7 days a week throughout the shipping season. The vessels are berthed at the mouth of the Black River, just east of the Desmond Marina in Port Huron.

You'll see them traveling to and from the foreign ships as pilots are put on and off the ships in Lake Huron just coming into the channel that leads to the St. Clair River.








McMorran Place



USCG Hollyhock

Port Huron is home to the United States Coast Guard cutter Hollyhock, which is permanently based and moored in Pine Park. Grove The cutter, named after a previous Coast Guard cutter that served the United States from 1937 through 1982, was launched on January 25, 2003 and after sea trials, took up her station in Port Huron in November of 2003. Hollyhock's

primary missions are aids-to-navigation (maintenance, removal and replacement), search and rescue, environmental protection and ice breaking.

The Hollyhock is the 14th Juniper Class Seagoing Buoy Tender built out of a projected 16 of this class. She is 225 feet long, displaces 2,000 long tons, and is powered by two diesel engines which power a single controllable



pitch propeller. Hollyhock equipped with bow and stern thrusters, addition to a 20 - ton hydraulic, 60-foot telescoping beam Appleton crane. carries a crew of eight officers and 42 enlisted personnel.

The Hollyhock's Dynamic

Positioning System allows a computer to take control of the engines, rudder, propeller and thrusters and can hold the ship within a 10-meter circle in winds up to 30 knots and eight foot seas, which allows pinpoint positioning of buoys. The vessel is responsible for nearly 150 aids-to-navigation on the lower Great Lakes.



The Grayfox

The Grayfox is a training ship used to offer hands-on experience in all aspects of shipboard operations. She is currently the largest Sea Cadet training ship in the United States. Finances needed to operate the vessel come from donations, grants, and fund raising activities conducted by the crew.



The Grayfox is utilized to train young men and women in sea going skills. She is used mostly for Sea Cadets, Marine Cadets, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, NJROTC, Sea Rangers and other youth organizations. She is also used as a designated Navy Reserve site.

The Grayfox is operated and maintained by cadets with Navy and Coast Guard personnel serving in a supervisory position. There are also several civilians who volunteer their time to assist in their endeavors.

Built by Marinette Marine in Marinette, WI in 1985, she was one of ten 120-foot type Torpedo Weapons Retrievers. Originally designed TWR 825, she was used to launch and retrieve test torpedoes and targets. It was

assigned to the U.S. Navy Atlantic Undersea Testing and Evaluation Center (AUTEC), Andros Island, Bahamas. Due to changing development of underwater weapons, TWR 825 was no longer needed by the Navy. The ship was taken to Green Springs, Florida and placed in mothballs in 1995. It was here that the vessel was

discovered by an enterprising group of sponsors who decided the Sea Cadets needed a ship to train on. A request was then made to the Secretary of the Navy to have her transferred to the Naval Sea Cadet Corps. Paperwork was set into motion, and TWR 825 was obtained on August 15, 1997. She arrived in Port Huron, Michigan on August 26, 1997.



Fort Gratiot Lighthouse




The original Fort Gratiot Lighthouse was established in 1825 to guard the juncture of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. That lighthouse was destroyed by a storm in 1828 and the current lighthouse, the oldest in Michigan, was built north of the fort in 1829. The white painted brick tower was extended from 74' to its present 86' in the early 1860s. The green flashing light was automated in 1933 and updated in 2016 and can be seen from 16 miles out in Lake Huron.

The entire campus has undergone a historic restoration under the ownership of St. Clair County Parks & Recreation Commission and the Port Huron Museum.








Cruise Weekend



Lake sturgeon populations have declined since the early 1900's, not just from historical over-fishing, but from habitat destruction and increasing pollution levels, and as a result were added to the Threatened Species list in Michigan. 

Port Huron Float Down



It's the Blue Water Area's favorite unorganized, unsanctioned, and unsponsored event ... it's called the Port Huron Float Down, and it somehow seems to take place every third Sunday in August, despite a cancellation each and every year by the United States Coast Guard.


Sunday, August 18

The event sees 3,000 or more people gathering at Lighthouse Beach in the early afternoon and floating down the St. Clair River to Marysville. There's even a website, but those who run it at porthuronfloatdown. com say they are in no way organizing, sponsoring, planning, or promoting the community event.

According to the site, the Float Down is a tradition steeped in history, even though it's impossible to know who the first people were to float down. The event, as it's known today, date back over 30 years. In 1986, a storm put an end to the fun, and it was officially ended by the United States Coast Guard in 1987. Although people continued to float every year, the Float Down did not officially resurface until 2008.

The traditional course of the Float Down is launching at Lighthouse (Conger) Beach, and then floating 8-miles downstream to Chrysler Beach in Marysville. The current moves guickest under the Blue Water Bridges, and then pulls you out towards the center of the river, near the mouth of the Black River. If you want to watch, the Edison Parkway, the Flag Plaza, the Blue Water Bridges, Pine Grove Park, Kiefer Park, or Lincoln Park are all the best places to watch the floaters

If you decide to float down the St. Clair River in August, there are several things you must consider before jumping in. The current is swift and the water is cold. All floaters should have a reliable inflatable and a paddle so they are able to stay out of the shipping channel. It's also wise to choose a float that can keep you dry and out of the water to prevent heat loss or hypothermia. Floaters should also have a Personal Floatation Device or a Life Jacket. Children should wear them at all times and adults should at least keep them at an arm's-length reach at all times. Most importantly, if you cannot swim, do not enter the water. There are no lifeguards or safety personnel.

Bell's Beer Bayview Mackinac Race

The Bell's Beer Bayview Mackinac Race (the Port Huron to Mackinac Race) will be celebrating its 95th consecutive year when the sailboats leave the starting line in southern Lake Huron on Saturday, July 20th. Bell's, a well-known Michigan brewery famous for their summer Oberon wheat ale and Two-Hearted Ale, among many other premium and specialty brands, has sponsored the race since 2011.

Almost 300 boats are expected to compete in this year's race. The boats are measured to determine handicaps, which are subtracted from their elapsed sailing time, except for the scratch boat. The scratch boat is the fastest boat in the fleet and is granted no time allowance handicap. Changes made in 2016 determine which course the boats can take. The changes set a "speed limit" for participation on the Shore Course, the shorter of the event's two courses, which follows the Michigan shoreline and covers 235 statute miles. The Shore Course is no longer an option for larger boats with a PHRF rating below 99 seconds per mile. The faster boats must sail the longer Cove Island course, a

distance of 298 statute miles. Slower boats will have the option of sailing either course. GPS tracking devices are placed on all participating sailboats so that fans from around the world are able to follow individual boats or the entire fleet on the Bell's Brewery and Bayview Yacht Club websites. The smallest boats start the race first, typically reaching the finishing line in front of the Grand Hotel on Mackinac Island on Sunday, with the larger vessels arriving by Tuesday.

The Blue Water Fest is held concurrently with the Port Huron to Mackinac Race. This annual family festival is held in Port Huron along the Black River, where the race boats are berthed. Activities include





Maritime Center/Vantage Point



The Great Lakes Maritime Center offers a variety of opportunities to learn about the history and current events of the Great Lakes. Video formats, displays, and speaker programs present a wide range of information.

A live underwater camera (also inside) lets you view activity under the St. Clair River. Plus, a displayed schedule of ship travels - in actual time - is available.

The Maritime Center is located at Vantage Point at the

junction of the Black and St. Clair Rivers. You can watch giant freighters pass right in front of you - less than a quarter mile away. You can sit on a sun-soaked deck outside or watch from inside the Maritime Center. An annual spring flower market is held at Vantage Point in May, followed by the annual farmer's market held June-October on Tuesdays and Saturdays from 8a-2p.

The Great Lakes Maritime Center is open daily, except holidays. Summer hours (8a to 7p): Memorial Day thru Labor Day. Visit achesonventures.com for more information.



Parks

The parks of Port Huron have something for everyone: swimming, sunbathing, boating, beaches, pools, picnicking, playgrounds and lots of water.

Lakeside Park, On the clear waters of Lake Huron, Lakeside Park boasts 1,050 feet of water frontage with clean sandy beaches. No lifeguards are on duty during the summer season. Lots of playground facilities, picnic areas, beach volleyball and restrooms are available. On the weekends you will find lots of boats anchoring offshore to enjoy the swimming and socializing. It is located just north of Holland Avenue and Gratiot Avenue intersection. A parking fee is in effect Memorial Day thru Labor Day.

Lighthouse Park, This is one of the most historic parks in the area with 900 feet of waterfront and beach on Lake Huron. Lighthouse Park is not recommended for swimming, due to the deep water and strong current. No lifeguards are on duty during the season. Picnic areas are available and the sunbathing is great. It is located at 3002 Conger Street, close to the newly renovated and opened Ft. Gratiot Lighthouse.

Court Street City Pool, Court Street offers a wonderful swimming pool and toddler pool with dressing room facilities. Tennis courts adjoin the area and the whole area connects with Memorial Stadium and the Port Huron High School field and track facility. A summer favorite located at 2025 Court Street in Port Huron's south end.

Sanborn Park City Pool, Sanborn Park has great variety in its almost 42 acres, with 12 outdoor lighted tennis courts, an outdoor pool facility that boasts a toddler pool, dressing room facilities, diving area, swim classes, swim team, swim exercise and more. This heavily wooded area also has playground equipment, a baseball diamond, outdoor basketball courts and picnic tables. It is located at the intersection of Sanborn and Pine Grove Avenue on Port Huron's north end.

Public Beaches



Lakeside Beach

Lakeside Park is one of Port Huron's finest parks and is home to 1,050 feet of lake frontage. A popular destination for tourists and locals, it's great for family gatherings, picnics and reunions. The park was recently updated with new and renovated facilities.

The park offers a large sandy beach for sunbathing and boating, with a designated swim area. On weekends, you will find lots of boats anchoring off shore to enjoy the swimming and socializing. Please note, however, that there are no life guards on duty.

The park features new bathrooms and a shower station, a concession stand and a children's area with a playscape and splash pad. Volleyball nets have made beach volleyball a popular pastime. There are picnic tables and grills that are permanently attached to cement pads throughout the park.

Residents of the City of Port Huron, Ft. Gratiot and Port Huron Townships may purchase a parking sticker that will allow access to the parking lot for the season for just \$5. St. Clair County residents may purchase a parking sticker for \$35 and have unlimited entrance to the park. Out-of-county residents will pay a \$10 daily entrance fee.

Blue Water Trails



Have a more intimate experience of the Blue Water Area by running, walking or biking on the many scenic trails in

Bridge to Bay Trail - Port Huron is in the heart of the Bridge to Bay Trail project. The Bridge to Bay Trail extends from St. Clair County's northern border, under the Blue Water Bridge and through Port Huron, Marysville, St. Clair, Marine City, and Algonac; past state and municipal parks, museums, gazebos, and lighthouses. Sometimes the trail is within reach of the water's edge and sometimes a few miles inland. It connects community with community for walkers, runners, strollers, and bicyclists of all ages.

Port Huron River Walk/Board Walk - If you'd like to spend some time on the St. Clair River waterfront, visit the River Walk that starts at Vantage Point in the Desmond District, south of the Black River in Port Huron. On the north side of the Black River, the board walk runs from the mouth of the Black River, through Pine Grove


Park, continuing to the Blue Water Bridge and the mouth of Lake Huron.

The Blue Water River Walk opened in 2014 and is a popular destination for residents and tourists. The River Walk land was gifted in 2011 to the Community Foundation of St. Clair County by local philanthropists, James and Suzanne Acheson. Located on the south side of Port Huron along the St. Clair River, the River Walk is an innovative example of how a public and private partnership can turn a damaged and neglected waterfront into a community treasure.

The Walk is almost one mile in length and includes a pedestrian trail, observation deck and an outdoor classroom that allows direct access to the water to learn about the restoration and naturalization of the shoreline.

Trestle Trail - For a more nature-oriented excursion. check out the Wadhams to Avoca Trail. The trail includes a sixty-foot high trestle that spans the Mill Creek Valley.





Island Loop Route National Water Trail

The Island Loop National Water Trail is the first national water trail in Michigan and one of only fourteen in the nation. The 10.2 mile long trail provides boaters and paddlers with a one-of-a-kind opportunity to navigate four bodies of water, pass by Michigan's oldest lighthouse and travel underneath the Blue Water Bridges.

Most of the water trail meanders through Fort Gratiot Township, Port Huron Township and the City of Port Huron, traveling the Black River, the Black River Canal, Lake Huron and the St. Clair River. With the exception of the waters under the Blue Water Bridge and in the St. Clair River, waterways along the route are calm and slow but you should wear a life jacket (PFD) at all times. Also be sure to have your ID with you, as the waters of Lake Huron and the St. Clair River are patrolled by Border Patrol Agents and they can stop you at any time and ask for proof of your citizenship.

Begin your journey either at the new Bakers Field Park in Port Huron Township or at the North River Road Park in Ft. Gratiot Township. Both sites have an ADA accessible kayak launches. Head downriver then east on the canal that links the Black River to Lake Huron. Enter Lake Huron after passing under the Taintor Gate. The Taintor Gate is open 96% of the time but be aware that it closes

> automatically when there is a strong North or Northeast wind. Closure of the gate protects the canal from getting filled with silt sand from the lake.

Once in Lake Huron, head south and paddle under the Blue Water Bridges and into the St. Clair River, along the international border with Canada. The St. Clair River section should only be attempted by experienced paddlers on a calm day. The water can be quite rough and the paddle is best attempted in the morning. Finish by entering the mouth of the Black River the west, paddling through the City of Port Huron and then you're back to where you started from.



2019 MI Chapter ACBS Boat Shows

In 2018, the Michigan Chapter of Antique and Classic Boat Society celebrated its 40th year of existence.

The Chapter was founded in 1978 and became the 6th chapter in a still new ACBS organization of about 500 members. ACBS has since grown into the largest society in the world dedicated to the preservation and enjoyment of historic, antique and classic boats. They embrace all styles of classic boats whether they are wood, fiberglass or metal with over 13,000 members and 54 Chapters.

The club got its start several years earlier as a picnic rendezvous every 4th of July at the waterfront home of B.A. (Bud) and Pat Aikens. Bud and Pat hosted this event as a way of getting friends with antique boats together for an afternoon of fun. Part of the weekend festivities was the City of Algonac Annual Boat Parade made up of a variety of local boats, both old and new. It was a "come and have some fun" parade that was enjoyed by all who either participated or watched from the shoreline.

That local parade has turned into an annual boat show held every year at the Algonac Harbour Club on the St. Clair River. It is the signature event of many that are held throughout the year by the Michigan Chapter.

Diving in the St. Clair River




Diving in the St. Clair River isn't for everyone. Near Port Huron, the fast current, at times exceeding 4k, makes navigation and diving difficult for those not physically fit and properly equipped and trained. The river depth ranges from 20' along the shore to over 80' in the center.

The river is one of the busiest waterways in the world, with hundreds of ships and boats passing through the narrow channel every day, adding to the danger for divers. It is one of the only spots in Michigan where a diver is not required to tow a dive flag because boats have the right of way. Instead, divers must put out two flags, one at the point of entry and one at the exit point. Due to the

heavy boat traffic, divers must treat this area as an overhead environment dive, surfacing only near their exit point.

Even though diving in the St. Clair River is challenging, the historical artifacts and shipwrecks can be difficult for divers to resist. On the bottom near Port Huron, divers can find the remains of at least 5 shipwrecks, an old steam crane, a model A Ford and many other items. On good days the visibility can be up to 80 feet and the ecosystem is one of the most diverse found in the Great Lakes. The way the bottom of the river constantly changes guarantees you'll never have the same dive twice.



Fishing in the Bluewater Area



Unless you reported into Canadian customs by phone and you have a Canadian fishing license, you need to stay on the U.S. side.

Some of the locals have been long lining successfully for silver fish behind kayaks outside of the harbors and break walls. With a kayak, you can get crazy close to the break walls, jetties, and other structures while giving your line more personal attention. For some, it's a preferred method of fishing. Kayaks available in the area have specialized rod holders.

Within thirty minutes north or south of Port Huron, along the shores of Lake Huron or the St. Clair River, you're able to catch King salmon, Chinook salmon, Atlantic salmon, Steelhead, Brown Trout, Lake Trout, Walleye, Silver Bass, Small Mouth Bass, Sturgeon, Whitefish, Muskie, Northern Pike, Suckers, and Carp.

In many of the Blue Water communities, there are miles of public seawall available for shore fishermen. If you have a physical impairment, you are encouraged to come. It's all accessible. In the Port Huron area, many fishermen use a railing attached winch-like device that remotely resembles a fishing pole, a local fishing technique for fishing in the heavy current. The pole, outfitted with the right line and tackle, is put into a railing clamped rod holder. At the end of the rod something just smaller than a church bell is clipped to the pole to notify the fisherman that they have a bite, allowing those fishing time to sit, relax and enjoy the scenery.

If you have a boat for fishing, there are boat launches in Algonac, Marine City, St. Clair, Port Huron, Lexington and Port Sanilac. Mastering how to catch fish out of your boat requires a stop at one of the local bait and tackle stores to get the "good stuff" and info on local tried and true techniques. Make sure your boat stickers are correct, and that the boat operator is NOT drinking.

The best fishing is on the shoreline in the river and the edge of the shipping lane in Lake Huron just above the Blue Water Bridge. While you're fishing, be aware of local hazards. We have very heavy current and massive freighters that you need to pay attention to. The St. Clair River is one of the busiest shipping waterways in the world AND THEY WILL NOT SWERVE TO GO AROUND YOU so stay out of the shipping channel.

Without knowing what's down there, you can lose a LOT of very expensive fishing equipment. Here's my advice for blind fishing those miles of seawall without knowing what's down there to snag on. You will need a railing attached rod holder, available locally, and a noodle rod. A noodle rod is around 9' to 12' long with a medium weight bail cast reel. You will have no more than six to eight pound test line with a very simple Eagle Claw type fish hook with a minnow attached. You will have a slip sinker or tear drop sinker about four feet above the hook. You lower the assembly into the current, find bottom, then bring it up four feet off the bottom. With this method, you can catch bass, walleye, brown trout, steel head, and everything else in the river! This technique is not widely used, but for the unaware visitor, it's one of the safest techniques to catch fish along that seawall.

Located between Port Huron, Michigan and Point Edward, Ontario and connecting both Interstate 94 and Interstate 69 with Canada's Highway 402, is one of the fastest links between the Midwest and Ontario as well as the Northeast United States - the Blue Water Bridge.

The crossing consists of two unique spans. The original Blue Water Bridge opened in 1938 and is the three-lane westbound bridge. The second Blue Water Bridge, which carries three lanes of eastbound traffic, is an impressive modern bridge that opened in 1997.

Duty Free shopping is located prior to the bridge entrances and tolls are paid at the entrance to the bridges in both Ontario and Michigan.

Tips for Crossing the Border

- Have toll payments ready.
- Approach inspection booths in a safe and orderly fashion and follow all posted or directed instructions.
- Turn off radio, cell phones, or anything that may be distractive to the border agent.
- Have your proof of citizenship (above) ready prior to arrival at the booth (passport, passport card, enhanced license, etc.)
- Have children's birth certificates ready and if traveling with children that are not immediate family, have a note or proof that they have permission to cross the border with you.

- Resident aliens must carry residency cards at all times.
- Declare all vegetables, fruits, animals, birds, plants and plant products, meat and meat products, and eggs.
- Declare all personal items.
- Don't fool around. Border agents take their jobs
- Be patient. The border is a very busy place.

Border Crossing Information

The Blue Water Bridge is an international crossing between the United States of America and the Dominion of Canada. As you enter either country you will be stopped and questioned prior to entry into that country. Each person in your vehicle must be able to prove their citizenship. For a complete list of Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative-compliant documents, visit the United States Department of Homeland Security at dhs.gov/files/crossingborders/travelers.shtm.

Identification Requirements (from cbp.gov/us-citizens/western-hemisphere-travel-initiative)

What types of documents are accepted for entry into the United States via land and sea?

- U.S. citizens can present a valid: U.S. Passport; Passport Card; Enhanced Driver's License; Trusted Traveler Program card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST), American Indian Card or Enhanced Tribal Card.
- U.S. and Canadian citizen children under the age of 16 (or under 19, if traveling with a school, religious group, or other youth group) need only present a birth certificate or other proof of citizenship. The birth certificate can be original, photocopy, or certified copy.
- WHTI does not affect U.S. Lawful Permanent Residents, who are still required to present their permanent resident card (Form I-551) or other valid evidence of permanent residence status.
- Canadian citizens can present a valid passport, Enhanced Driver's License, or Trusted Traveler Program card (NEXUS, SENTRI or FAST).
